The function of a Heritage Impact Assessment

✓ Decision making tool

- \checkmark as objective as possible
- \checkmark transparent and accountable
- ✓ Monitoring tool

✓ can be used as a database for monitoring programs


✓ Proactive management tool

- ✓ clarifies for all stakeholders the key issues to be considered in planning and management
- ✓ sets out the priorities in management > management plan strategic objectives

World Heritage Outstanding Universal Value (OUV)

The statement of the OUV is the base for all conservation and management decisions concerning the Old City of Dubrovnik World Heritage property.

It is decided by the World Heritage Committee when Dubrovnik was inscribed on the WH List



Site setting and context Any change can have an impact inside or outside the World Heritage property

Interpreting OUV in Dubrovnik

How to go about:

Identification of attributes within the inscribed World Heritage property and its setting that are associated with or express OUV

Identification of attributes **outside** the World Heritage property within its setting that could potentially be associated with or express future OUV

Identification or attributes within the inscribed World Heritage property and its setting that are associated with or express other cultural values

Old City of Dubrovnik attributes

Attributes can be physical or associative and can be:

- ✓ physical elements, for example the defence system and key monuments
- ✓ relationships between the elements, for example the functional and symbolic relationship between the old city and the mountain and the sea
- ✓ processes, for example the continuity of the living city,
- ✓ associative elements; traditions, places of memory, visual appreciation

The main narratives of Old City of Dubrovnik

The defense, trade and political landscape:

The medieval structure of a fortified town (including economic, political and associative importance)

The historic urban landscape:

The urban historical complex; architecture, urban planning and infrastructure system (territorial scale) and

The associative landscape

Depending on the type of cultural heritage, and its cultural context, properties may be understood to meet the conditions of authenticity if their cultural value (as recognized in the nomination criteria proposed) are truthfully and credibly expressed through a variety of attributes including:

- form and design;
- materials and substance;
- use and function;
- traditions, techniques and management systems;
- location and setting;
- language, and other forms of intangible heritage;
- <u>spirit and feeling; and</u>
- other internal and external factors.
